Belgian Boat 2025-2026 & US Boat 2024-2025

Belgian boat 2025-2026

The Belgian American Educational Foundation is pleased to welcome 89 new Belgian fellows for this academic year 2025-2026! Among them, 77 are newly funded and 12 have been designated as Honorary fellows, mainly due to extra funding (Fayat Beurs, Fulbright, U.S. university grants, etc.).

Graduate fellowships :

11 fellows pursuing an *initial Master's degree*, representing a 2-year long fellowship for up to \$112 000 in funding.

5 people are joining UC Berkeley, while the other 6 others head towards Columbia U., Georgetown U., Pratt Institute, the University of Chicago and 2 at UT Austin .

Unfortunately, the Music Selection Committee could not recommend a music fellow., due to the small pool of applicants.

10 fellows pursuing a *Complementary Master's degree* at the following universities :

3 at Columbia U., and 1 at NYU, MIT, Tufts U., Georgia Tech, UT Austin, UC Berkeley and UC San Francisco.

7 fellows pursuing an *LL.M.*, with 3 at NYU, followed by 1 in Columbia U, Yale U., Harvard U. and Georgetown U..

5 fellows in a *Master's of Business Administration (MBA)*. 2 at Warton, Harvard BS, NYU-Stern BS and 1 **MPA** at Columbia U.

Research fellowships :

8 Master's researchers, holders of a Bachelor's degree who have chosen to devote a gap year to conduct research at top US universities' laboratories. The fellows are mainly in the bio-medical field : 4 at Harvard Med School and 1 at Yale U., John Hopkins U., Weil Cornell Med. and UC Berkeley.

33 postdoctoral researchers aiming to deepen or enlarge their respective research fields at their chosen universities, as well as **3 doctoral researchers** focusing on their PhD research projects.



A record number of US applicants

The number of U.S. applicants reached an all-time high of 83, an unprecedented number thus far. The American Fellowship Committee selected 14 US fellows who have accepted to pursue their studies or research in Belgium.


